What does growing up in the current time mean for young women? This is the question that Salome Müller and Andrea Arežina asked themselves when they thought back to their own youth. Back to insecurity, shame, the pressure to be thin, the closeness and competition among best friends, the worry of being excluded and not belonging, the feeling of helplessness when men stared at them and followed them home, and the feeling of fear.

How is it for young women today? They have grown up with social media, have heard of #metoo, and have experienced feminism as a new power. LGBTQI+ is a familiar term.

Do they feel more self-determined and free? Has being a woman become easier?

Young women talk about themselves – about falling in love and sex, about peer pressure and bullying, about relationships and their first high.
