

Childhood is a subject of controversial discussion in our society: The prevailing notion that children should be nurtured as early as possible in order to be competitive later on in life often overshadows their inherent differences and abilities. Children who do not smoothly conform are quickly pathologised, and it seems as if childhood is increasingly characterised by risk, illness, and dysfunction.

Parents feel pressured to be perfect, striving to make their children as successful as possible. The challenge manifests on multiple levels, from navigating digital media to providing optimal support, and the right balance between freedom and control for a child.

This book presents current developments and their underlying causes. The goal is to contribute to a more relaxed approach to parenting and to temper the ongoing debate that oscillates between romanticising and perfecting childhood.

What does growing up in the current time mean for young women? This is the question that Salome Müller and Andrea Arežina asked themselves when they thought back to their own youth. 



Sounds idyllic: a small house on the outskirts of Munich with its own garden. This is where Lars Reichardt lives together with a variety of quaint residents in a shared-living arrangement: Birgit is an entomologist, Li from China is young and fashion-conscious, Rudi is a prominent rock video producer from Austria.

What other living concepts might there be for someone who does not want to live as a small family unit or as a single person? This is a question many people ask themselves today in the face of overpriced rents and increasing isolation.
